

### This year we are pleased to announce... Stuart Harting as the Recipient of the 2019 Alfred E Driscoll Award Recipient

A native of Baltimore, Stuart Harting ventured north to attend Temple University and graduated from its School of Business. He has been a Haddonfield resident for more than 30 years. More importantly, Stu and his wife Beverly have been married for 46 years and have two grown children and five grandchildren who live in town.

For more than 40 years he has been a real estate broker and developer in the tri-state area, winning awards including the Architecture/Ecological award for The Greenhouse in Bala Cynwyd, PA; and the First Residential Historic Development Award from the Pennsylvania Historic Commission for the Sugar Refinery Apartments in Old City Philadelphia.

In his free time, Stuart has been an actively engaged Haddonfield civic leader. He has been a member of the Borough's Planning Board since 2013; member of the Rotary Club of Haddonfield; past member of the First Night Finance Committee; lifetime member of Haddonfield Historic Society, Past Chair of Building Committee, and current member of the Fundraising Committee for the new Archives Center and obtained the Center's new roof at no cost; founding partner of Haddonfield International Exchange which currently has 2 students from China attending HMHS (and he'll be leading a group to China this summer). Outside of town he has been a past Trustee for 30 years of Oaks (formerly Family Service); served as real estate advisor to Respond in Camden; past member of the Delaware River Ferry Commission; past chair of the West Shipyard Preservation Trust; past chair of Temple University's Business School Advisory Board; and has been a guest lecturer at The Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania in Entrepreneurial Decision-Making; Temple University School of Business; and Drexel University School of Business.

With his and his family's longtime interest in the arts and especially in outdoor sculpture, Stuart decided in 2013 to build on the beauty of several sculptures in town and create the Haddonfield Outdoor Sculpture Trust - also known as HOST a public/private nonprofit entity working closely with the Borough. In just a few short years as the visionary Founder and Chair of the HOST Board of Trustees, downtown Haddonfield has been populated with more than two dozen traditional and contemporary sculptures by internationally-recognized artists including a giant red heart... a couple on a bench... a refugee from El Salvador... a woman astride a bull... a giant postman... and even a ballerina. This walkable showcase has added tremendously to Haddonfield's unique quality of life and overall appeal. This year the Commissioners declared April to be Haddonfield Sculpture Month, with an inaugural series of free fun family activities and the installation of new sculptures including the Children's Sculpture Zoo in Tatem Garden and a bright blue dog based on a true story. For all this and more, Stuart was recently honored as "Community Partner of the Year" by the Non-Profit Development Center of Southern New Jersey and now, the Haddonfield Civic Association's Alfred E. Driscoll Award.

Driscoll Community Service Award honoring the late Governor Driscoll, a distinguished citizen of Haddonfield and the State of New Jersey.
