Lisa Hurly as the Recipient of the 2021 Alfred E Driscoll Award Recipient

Ms. Hurly was born and raised in Queens, NY and graduated from Glassboro State College. She has been married to her husband Steve for 23 years, and at the recommendation of Steve's old college roommate Keith Schwab, Lisa and Steve settled in Haddonfield 17 years ago. In many ways, Lisa credits the Borough with saving her life.

Lisa came to Haddonfield while pregnant with their 3rd child and purchased their home from Janet Lyons who introduced them to Dr. Ronald Librizzi. Lisa credits the incredible work and foresight of Dr. Librizzi with saving her life during childbirth. Family is the most important thing in Lisa's life. Her five 5 children are her constant inspiration and reason for everything she does.

Lisa's volunteer work has focused around helping children: her own and others'. She has spent countless hours coaching soccer and baseball; she has served on the Haddonfield Soccer Board; and she's helped with numerous school activities and acted as a team parent for a variety of youth sports. Additionally, Lisa has focused much of her life on helping families in need. She has organized and hosted many fundraisers for specific families facing medical crises or families who have fallen on hard times. Many of these instances have been at her and her family's personal expense.

Lisa's greatest passion has been creating the organization Help Women and Children Now, which she established upon moving to Haddonfield. This incredible non-profit was created in honor of their son, Stephen Michael Hurly, who passed away at just five weeks, from a combination of heart disease and premature birth.

Lisa states “Haddonfield has been so intertwined with my passions. I began this organization in 2006 with the help of some dear friends here in Haddonfield. They stood behind me and helped me start and run this organization for nearly 10 years.” During this time, the organization funded and performed home-makeovers for four families in need and hosted Kidzfest, a large kid-centric festival raising over \$400,000.00 in the fight against premature birth and heart disease. Lisa looks fondly upon this event as it not only focused on children, but also got children involved in its execution. The original Board of Help Women and Children Now consisted mainly of fellow Haddonfield residents with two notable exceptions: her sister Jo-Anne and best childhood friend, Abbie Levine. The event was a Haddonfield staple and an all-out family event for years. Lisa takes very little credit for this success, instead crediting the “tireless efforts from so many people in Haddonfield”. In her words, “it was overwhelming and inspiring.” In Lisa’s estimation, this event represented the true-essence of what Haddonfield is – a true community.

Four years ago, Lisa changed the face of Help Women and Children Now and turned leadership of the non-profit over to an all high school Student Board which now runs the organization. Through her vision and mentorship, along with that of the Board, the high school students now make all organizational decisions and continue to plan and host events. In the first year under student leadership, Help Women and Children Now raised over \$60,000.00. Lisa’s vision is for the high school members of the Board to continue to mentor Middle School students to take their place as they move up to the adult oversight Board. For all this and more, Lisa was recently honored as “Community Partner of the Year” by the Non-Profit Development Center of Southern New Jersey and now, the Haddonfield Civic Association’s Alfred E. Driscoll Award.

Lisa Hurly embodies the spirit of the Alfred E. Driscoll Community Service Award through her actions, and motivating others to get involved in the Community through volunteer activities. The Haddonfield Civic Association is proud to bestow this award upon Lisa, and to add her name to the distinguished list of past award recipients.

Alfred E. Driscoll Community Service Awards

Since 1931 the Haddonfield Civic Association has been presenting the Alfred E. Driscoll Community Service Award honoring the late Governor Driscoll, a distinguished citizen of Haddonfield and the State of New Jersey. The award was renamed in 1975 to recognize uncommon effort on behalf of the community with the intention that those who receive it will inspire others, and that it will encourage broader participation in the activities of the Haddonfield community.
